School Dinners



Let Children be Children

Help back our campaign to let children be children. Lots of our kids have told us they play 18 rated games at home. Some of them have said they have had nightmares about them.

We know, that like us, you want your children to be safe. Some of these games are rated as 15 and 18

to protect children who aren't ready to see this kind of violence and adult behaviour.

This kind of behaviour is not suitable for our children to be seeing, and can affect how they behave. We have had incidents where children have been hurt in the playground while acting out these games, as they think that the level of violence in the games is acceptable in real life.

Uniform Reminder

It is really important that children come to School in the correct uniform, as it makes them look smart and proud to be part of the Jubilee Family. All children except Nursery must wear a tie, which are available for £2.50 from the School Office. We will contact parents of children who do not have one, so



please help by making sure that your child wears their tie every day! Children must wear school shoes or pumps, and are not allowed to wear trainers, sandals or any other unsuitable footwear. Any children who do not have school shoes will need to change into their PE pumps once they get to School. If your child does not have PE pumps they will need to exchange their shoes for a pair of Schools pumps, and will only be given their shoes back once the pumps are returned at the end of the day.

PE kits should be brought into School on a Monday and taken home on a Friday/ at the end of Half Term. It is really important that your child has a full PE kit including pumps so that they can take part in all lessons, and the great activities with Commando Joe!

School pumps are available to buy from ShoeZone in Walsall for £2.49, and from Asda Living in Walsall for £2.50-£4 so please make sure that your child has some!
